At our Session meeting a couple of months ago, Melanye Lundsford shared with us an idea that she was tinkering with. She told us about a friend who was using social media to ask people to stop at a particular time during the day and pray for a family member's medical need. Melanye explained that had sparked an idea for the same sort of thing with the church using our address number, "202." "Maybe we could ask everyone to stop every day at 2:02pm and say a little prayer for our church," she suggested. We all thought that was an excellent idea! Such a good and imaginative idea in fact, that we've been developing and growing it into a larger campaign for ways to strengthen and get the word out about the great things going on at CPC.

possibly the Session Room, depending on the number of


