## From the Pastor



It's August already! Can you believe it? There are a couple of important things that I would like to share as Summer winds down and Fall is coming up fast.

First, I ask that everyone be in prayer for our mission team as we go to serve alongside brothers and sisters in Mexico, building large cement cisterns so families can have adequate and safe water. Particularly remember our two young men, Wesley Nicholson and Matthew Gurney. An experience like this trip can truly help mold the rest of their lives. John Gurney and I will be going along as well, together with another young man from Brownsville, two other "veteran" cistern ministry teamers, and Andy Combs (who was with us in worship on July 14). Andy's passion keeps this ministry alive in our presbytery. Prayer guides that follow readings that we will be using on the trip are available for everyone to pray along with us. Please be a part, and surround us with your prayers.



Second, several weeks ago, I preached on part of the prophet Elijah's story found in 1 Kings 19. I spoke about an issue which affects us all -our mental health- and especially depression. I certainly couldn't say everything that needed to be said, but I wanted to be sure to follow up with some great resources I found. One is from an article entitled, "How Elijah Teaches About Mental Health" from the Gateway of Hope website: <https://gwhope.org/elijah-teaches-mental-health>. In it, Deborah Simon summarizes three lessons we can learn from Elijah's story in 1 Kings:

1. "We need to take care of ourselves physically. (Elijah was exhausted!) When we are tired we need to get enough sleep. And we need to eat the right foods to give us energy." Don't neglect your body's physical needs!

### **THISTLE & BEE** **Monday, August 12** **9:30am, meet at church** **10:30am, tour**

Thistle & Bee is a non-profit organization/social enterprise that aims to provide workforce preparedness and healing programs designed to transform women who are victims of human trafficking and addiction. This is done through its therapy program and social enterprise built around the sale of natural products made from honey such as bath, body and home products as well as pure honey. There are currently four women in residence at the Thistle & Bee home in Memphis.

St. Columbia, an Episcopalian camp in Memphis, has provided an acre of land where flowers and herbs are grown providing the products needed by Thistle & Bee to support their home. The participants are involved in every step of the process, including building the bee hives and being trained as beekeepers. There are over a dozen honey bee hives on the St. Columbia property and over 80 bee hives scattered across the Memphis with the first bee hives positioned on the Collierville Baptist Hospital grounds.

The Thistle and Bee home was previously the Community of St. Therese of Lisieux home that was started by Sandra Ferrell about four years ago. PW Presbytery, as well as the CPC PW group, have supported St. Therese since its inception as well as our PW group. When Thistle & Bee contacted St. Therese to see if they could lease the home, this gave Sandra an opportunity to start a new ministry. Sandra and other volunteers began ministering to the ladies on the street. They go out and visit with the women there, feeding them and providing necessities with the goal to build trust. They are currently working on plans for a drop-in center for ladies working the streets as a way to help them. Their goal is to open a drop-in-center where the women will be able to escape the weather, rest, eat a meal, shower and wash their clothes.

We will be meeting at CPC to carpool to the Thistle & Bee home at 9:30 a.m. The location is an unpublished address so if anyone needs the address to drive directly there please contact Mary Ann Epperson at 901.218.5851.


Simple and good advice for us all! But sometimes we need other help as well to get our minds back on track. There's no shame at all in that!

## ~ PROPAPA MISSIONS ~

Recently, Dave Parks reached out to share about his last visit to Pajuiles, Honduras. Since CPC members helped install a water system, they have produced over 128,673 gallons of purified water!

While in Pajuiles, several children being sponsored to attend school visited with the group. It was then shared that there is a need for sponsors of 14 more children.

ProPapa is a non-profit organization that, among other activities, supports efforts to improve health, education, and housing for those in need, particularly in the Province of Yoro, Honduras. The Scholarship Program began in 1999 with 26 students. There are now over 300 students in the Program each year. To date, there have been 1,410 students that have been enrolled in the Program!

Those seeking scholarships are screened by the Honduras ProPapa staff. Those viable are sent to Shirley Sholtis who oversees the education program from the U.S. to "match" with a sponsor. Sponsorship is for the calendar year which starts in February. Right now, they are looking to secure sponsors by November for the 2020 school year. While there is no fee to attend public school, families are responsible for the providing a uniform and basic school supplies. Your sponsorship will help provide a uniform (shirt, pants/skirt, and shoes), backpack, books and basic school supplies. The provided form lists the levels or the opportunity to make any donation. Also included is a letter providing an update of the 2018 school year. The 2019 letter will come out sometime in November.


### **A DEACONS ORDINATION**

# PRO-PAPA MISSIONS SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

## 2018 Update

Dear Friends and Sponsors,

**Thank you** for your continued support of the *PRO-PAPA Missions Scholarship Program*. For those of you who are new to this Program, the school year in Honduras begins in February and runs through November. Last year we celebrated 20 years of PRO-PAPA Missions' work in Honduras. This year we provided 335 students in the program with their school needs (a uniform, shoes, school book, back pack, notebooks and pencils) as well the incentive that comes from knowing that someone cares enough to sponsor them. The students live in Urraco and seven neighboring villages. The coordination and work in Honduras is done by Sister Laurinda Mayer and Honduran coordinators Fanny, Angel, and Francesca. Parents volunteer to help coordinate in their villages. The students have to attend school regularly and maintain their grades to be eligible to remain the Program. The sponsors receive one letter and photo from the student(s) during the school year. The letters are written at the end of the previous school year, so you may wonder why they are talking about Christmas! The letters are translated by students in Honduras who are learning English, so if something in your letter doesn't sound quite right, contact me. They do a great job but sometimes language and translating can be tricky! For example, "colegio" refers to secondary school. "Padrino" or "Madrina" means godparent but is used to refer to 'Sponsor.' The sponsors are encouraged to send a note and photo to the students in return. The kids love to know about their sponsors!

My contact information is below. Please contact me with any questions or suggestions you have regarding the Scholarship Program! Remember, the kids love getting a letter or photo from their sponsors! Just send it to me and we'll get it translated and delivered.



## 2018 Update

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It has been quite a year for Honduras – not in a good way. You probably have seen the news on TV, in the papers or on line. The Honduran Presidential elections last year created much unrest in the country resulting in protests and violence. Some of our mission groups didn't go on their annual trips because it was too unsettled at the time they would have had to make their plans and buy airline tickets. A few of the PRO-PAPA groups did make the trip in 2018 and all went well.

This past year there has also been a lot of news coverage about the large number of people leaving Honduras and heading to the US. We watched the news coverage of the children being separated from their parents at the border. In October we see news of the caravan of people walking from Honduras to Mexico and the United States.

The reason for mentioning these events is not to get political in any way. I feel that we can't just ignore that "elephant in the room" as the saying goes. I hear discussions and opinions everywhere on both sides of immigration issues, etc. All I know is this - For the past 20 years we have been working to make a difference in the lives of families so they can make a better life for themselves in their homeland. The problem is so overwhelming and what we offer is a small token in light of it all. Sometimes the task seems daunting and we may wonder if we are really making a difference. But all we can do is try to make a small improvement where we can in whatever way we can. There are good people with nowhere else to turn.

Earlier this year I saw a news story about Nikki Haley, the US Ambassador to the United Nations. Ms. Haley made a trip to Honduras and it caught my attention when she visited school students there:

*A few weeks later, Rita Braver (from CBS News) traveled to Honduras with Ambassador Haley as she conferred with senior officials; witnessed a drug enforcement exercise; and also made time to visit a U.S.-funded afterschool program.*

*Haley said, "If they get education and they get training, then we know that they're going to be productive. If they don't, we'll be dealing with resentful children that are uneducated and angry, and that's what we don't want."*

*"You sound like a liberal," said Braver.*

*"I'm not a liberal, I assure you. I am a conservative who understands prevention saves us a lot more money in the long run."*

But the purpose of discussing this is to say THANK YOU for your support and for the difference you are making to the students and their families who are struggling in Honduras.

With so many other issues and natural disasters throughout the world, and with so many good causes to support, you are helping our mission. We appreciate your continued support more than words can express!

I did not make it to Honduras in 2018 and I sure did miss seeing everyone. As a result I have no pictures to share from a current trip, but I can tell you that the Honduran coordinators and parents have been busy getting the students through the school year!

Turning to me he simply said, "**I made a difference to that one.**"


